Bakdil Program Health Manager Visits Siju AAM-PHC



BAKDIL marked a proud milestone as all five of its AAM Primary Health Centres — Babadam, Siju, Gabil, Salmanpara, and Wagesi — managed under the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) mode with the Government of Meghalaya, successfully earned the prestigious National Quality Standards Assurance (NQAS) Certification.

This accomplishment formed a major part of a larger state-level success in Meghalaya, where ten public health facilities were awarded NQAS certification. These included Ganesh Das MCH Hospital in Shillong, as well as the PHCs of Marngar, Nongalbibra, Pomlum, and Asananggre.

In addition, 91 Sub-Centre Health & Wellness Centres (SC HWCs – AAM) across the state also received NQAS certification. Among them were two Sub-Centres run by BAKDIL under Salmanpara and Wagesi **PHCs** Anangpara SC and Lower Sambrak SC further strengthening BAKDIL's reputation as a consistent advocate for quality healthcare delivery the grassroots.



This collective achievement reflected the combined efforts and commitment of multiple stakeholders, including BAKDIL, the Health & Family Welfare Department,

Government of Meghalaya, the Joint Directorate Committee (JDC). Directorate Quality Teams, DM&HO, NHM, Quality Teams of four Garo Hills districts, MHIS, MHSSP-IPA, and MMDSL. Together, they worked towards raising the standard of healthcare ensuring that excellence reached even the most remote regions of Meghalaya.

For BAKDIL, this moment stands as a testament to its mission-driven work, sustained partnership with the government, and unwavering dedication to improving community health through quality-based systems.

Technical Training under IMEP-III Successfully Completed at BAKDIL Training Centre, Baghmara

MSSDS: Integrated Farming Programme on Poultry & Mushroom Launched at Selsella Block



14th October 2025 – The official inauguration of the Integrated Farming Programme on Poultry and Mushroom was successfully held at Selsella Block, West Garo Hills District. The event was graced by key dignitaries, including the MSSDS SDO, Director of BAKDIL, Fr. Benoy, representatives from the FPO Selsella Block, and two Veterinary Doctors. The programme was conducted smoothly and marked the formal beginning of the initiative.

The three-month training programme, which commenced on 7th October 2025, aims to equip participants with practical skills in poultry rearing and mushroom cultivation as part of a sustainable livelihood model.



As part of the hands-on learning component, a mushroom practical training session was held on 29th October 2025 at Selsella Block. During the session, 50 trainees received one packet each of mushroom spawn to begin cultivation at their own homes, enabling them to immediately apply the knowledge gained.

The programme is expected to strengthen incomegenerating opportunities for rural households by promoting integrated farming practices.

FARM IV: Farmers' Knowledge Sharing and Indigenous Seed Distribution Held at Thapa Danggre Village



A Farmers' Knowledge Sharing and Indigenous Seed Distribution Programme was conducted under the FARM IV Project at Thapa Danggre Village, North Garo Hills District, under the C&RD Resubelpara Block. The event aimed to encourage sustainable agricultural practices by promoting the use of indigenous seeds and facilitating the exchange of traditional farming knowledge among local farmers.
